

# Private Lesson Studio Policy Pamela Ambrose, cello

Welcome! I'm delighted that you will be studying with me! I believe that learning to play the cello is a wonderful process, and I hope that you will find it so. Please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns.

## **Teaching Philosophy and Goals**

Playing the 'cello is fun! Everyone has their own learning style, and I approach each student with that knowledge, so as to bring out their full potential.

### **Required Materials**

- Music stand (for home use, does not need to be brought to lessons)
- Metronome
- Tuner
- Beginners Suzuki book 1
- Dampit
- Your cello

#### **Syllabus**

For beginners, I start by working on how to sit with the instrument. Then progress to playing open strings, both plucking and using the bow, and then getting the left hand set up. I incorporate ear-training and note-reading into the lesson.

#### **Student Responsibilities**

- Practice! Every day, even if just a few minutes.
- Participate in recitals-I schedule one recital per semester for my students. This affords you an opportunity to practice playing in front of people.
- Bring your music to your lessons!

#### **Recommendations for Parents:**

- Renting an instrument: There are a variety of choices, but we've had good luck with Johnson String Instruments and recommend starting there
- Help your child set up a practice schedule and stick to it
- Be unconditionally enthusiastic about progress!
